From the Commander

I want to wish everyone a happy new year! Yes, we made it through 2021 keeping the Post open for the majority of the time. In the 1930s, it became a supply depot, which it still is for the Oregon National Guard. It also currently houses the Oregon Military Museum. The new museum is called the General James B. Thayer Museum after James Thayer whose platoon on May 4, 1945, liberated a concentration camp in Wels, Austria. He was from Beaverton and owned a supply business.

It looks like we might have a candidate for Commander so I will keep you updated on this critical issue. Our Post currently has a Commander, First Vice, Second Vice, Adjutant, Finance Officer, Chaplain and Sgt. of Arms along with three E- Board members. The USS Oregon (SSN 793) Commissioning in the Spring of '22



The USS OREGON (SSN 793) the twentieth Virginia-class nuclearpowered fast attack submarine. The Virginia-class submarine is the U.S. Navy's newest undersea warfare platform and incorporates the latest in stealth, intelligence gathering and weapons systems technology.

The SSN 793 will be the second naval ship to bear the name Oregon. The first USS Oregon was a battleship (BB 3) best known for its roles in the Spanish American War when it helped destroy Admiral Cervera's fleet and in the Philippine-American War; it performed blockade duty in Manila Bay and off Lingayen Gulf, served as a station ship, and aided in the capture of Vigan. BB 3, known as the "Bulldog of the Navy", set a record of 66 days to sail from San Francisco to Havana, Cuba in response to the sinking of the USS Maine (ACR 1) in 1898.

The next-generation of attack submarines will provide the Navy with the capabilities required to maintain the nation's undersea supremacy well into the 21st century. They will have enhanced stealth, sophisticated surveillance capabilities and special warfare enhancements that will enable them to meet the Navy's multi-mission requirements.

ABOUT THE BOAT -Length: 377 ft. -Beam: 34 ft. -Displacement (Weight): 7,800 tons -Speed: 25+ knots (28+ miles per hour) -Maximum Depth: 800+ ft. -Crew: 15 officers. 117 enlisted ARMAMENT -4 Torpedo Tubes -2 Virginia Payload Tubes (VPT), each capable of holding 6 vertical launch Tomahawk missiles that can strike targets over 1,200 miles away. TECHNOLOGY -Sonar able to detect ships 3,000 miles away. -Photonics masts carrying thermal imaging and low-light cameras; replacing the telescope. -Nuclear reactor which powers the sub for the 30+ year lifespan Pump jet propulsion for quieter movement.

These submarines will have the capability to attack targets ashore with highly accurate Tomahawk cruise missiles and conduct covert, long-term surveillance of land areas, littoral waters or other seabased forces. Other missions include antisubmarine and anti-ship warfare; mine delivery and minefield mapping. They are also designed for special forces delivery and support.

Each Virginia-class submarine is 7,800tons and 377 feet in length, has a beam of 34 feet, and can operate at more than 25 knots submerged. It is designed with a reactor plant that will not require refueling during the planned life of the ship, reducing lifecycle costs while increasing underway time.

The submarine is being built in partnership with General Dynamics/Electric Boat Corp., at Electric Boat in Groton, Connecticut.

The christening ceremony for the boat occurred in October of 2019 in Groton, CT, when the sponsor of the submarine, Mrs. Dana Richardson, broke the bottle of champagne on the boat's hull. The Navy expects to commission SSN 793 in the spring of 2022.
