The PACT Act will provide much needed health care for millions of veterans who were exposed to contaminants emanating from open-air burn pits, atomic radiation, Agent Orange and other environmental poisons. He said it will also provide additional resources and staff to the Department of Veterans Affairs and that President Biden is expected to sign the bill in the very near future, possibly by the 4th of July.

Commander Dillard also mentioned that our veterans need and deserve much more help and asked us to get involved by writing to our Congressmen and Senators advocating various veteran causes.

The Commander told many fun and interesting stories which we all enjoyed and learned from. It was a from-the-heart wonderful talk.

After his talk I presented a memento gift from our Post to Commander Dillard and the National Commander Aide Walter Ivie. Giving a memento gift is a tradition when the National Commander visits a Post.
