From the Commander

Updates: It took us a while to find the perfect commercial refrigerator to fit the kitchen space and we finally found one at Home Depot. It was primarily funded by a grant obtained from the City of Sherwood, in conjunction with Metro, that we received mid last year. The refrigerator replaces the existing side by side refrigerator freezer that we had. The new one has almost 5 cu. ft. more food storage, and it has a smaller foot print which now allows us to swing the door into the kitchen instead out into the main The cabinets above the existing refrigerator had to be moved up over 6" to accommodate the taller refrigerator. Thank you to Nick Peters and Chris Garcia for performing this task, and picking up the refrigerator from Home Depot and getting it installed. From the Service Officer

Are you eligible to receive VA disability compensation? The rules have changed so you might now be eligible. What you need to do is contact an accredited Veteran Service Officer (VSO) to provide claim representation. It is recommended that you don't hire an outside attorney because it is not necessary. The accredited VSO will help in filing a claim for disability benefits in Oregon. It is free and confidential. The VSO will help you file a claim proving eligibility using legal, military and medical evidence. To find a VSO In Washington County you can call 503-846-3060, Yamhill County call 503-434-7503, Clackamas County 503-650-5631, and Multnomah 503-988-8387.

Longtime Bartender Jean Allen Retired After Over 37 years of Dedicated Service



Jean Allen, our long time bartender of over 37 years, decided it was time to retire, so she chose Sunday, May 25th as her last day as a Post 56 bartender. I recently had the pleasure of interviewing Jean and here is what she had to say about her life at the Legion.

"I grew up in Sherwood and now live on the 9 acres, in Sherwood, that I purchased in 1972. This is the location of our family business, Cedar Creek Nursery, and recently we celebrated 53 years in business.

I began my bartending career working at the Klines Bar and Restaurant in Sherwood, located in an area that was called Six Corners. It was owned by the Klines family and the restaurant name was later changed to The Peddler. The Klines were very nice people and everyone called them Pop and Mom. I worked for them for many years and eventually became Bar Manager. When Mom died everything began to change and eventually the business was sold to Bill McCormick of McCormick and Schmicks fame. Bill hired a couple to run the operation and soon after the wife came to me to talk about my new hours. I said no thanks and gave my two weeks' notice and went home to work in the nursery.

One day in 1988, not long after I left the restaurant, I was out working in the nursery with dirt in my hands when Harry Godel, the Bar Manager of the Legion, stopped by to see me. He asked if I would come and bartend at the Legion, and I immediately said yes. That was the start of my Legion journey.

I've been an ALA member longer than working at the Legion. I joined through my dad, Don Allen, a World War II Veteran. To me the Legion is not just a job. The people I have met over the years are good friends, like family. I watched some of the members grow up and even baby sat a few of them. I might be retiring but the Legion still will be a part of me forever. Actually, I could probably write a book with all the stories about the Legion, and It would be quite a story."

I'm sure we will still see Jean at the Legion hanging out with friends. I will certainly miss all the yummy food she would bring in on Sundays, especially her homemade lasagna. Thank you, Jean, for your friendship and all your years of dedicated service.


An estimated 175 attended Bob's Celebration of Life.
