#### **Robin Hood Festival**

Unlike Cruisin' Saturday, the weather for the Sherwood Robin Hood Festival was absolutely beautiful. The streets of six city blocks of Old Town Sherwood were closed off and filled with vendor's booths selling everything from food, home crafts, jewelry, clothing, face painting for the children and more. Lots of people, including families with young children, started arriving early to set up chairs along the parade route. #### From the Service Officer

A question I often get is how to obtain a copy of a DD214. All veterans get a copy of their 214 when released from active duty. The DD214 is proof of your service. All branches use the same form with the exception of the National Guard which issues a form 22 for periods of service that don't qualify for a DD214. The 22 is a separate document that covers periods of service such as weekend drills.

The DD stands for Defense Department and provides veterans with an accurate summary of active duty service. It usually lists dates of service, any commendations or medals received and the reason for separation, and the type of discharge.

You are entitled to your record free of charge. You will need your 214 to verify military for benefits, retirement and membership in veterans' organizations like the American Legion. A spouse will also need a copy for a funeral service to receive patriotic honors.

All this being said, how do you get your copy? There are several ways to get your copy via the federal government. Go to eVetRecs website or the VA website and search for records to electronically file for one. You can also get it by mail by downloading the SF180 form and mailing it in. This method is much slower than online filing. Another method is to contact the County Service Officer for help. Remember there is no need to pay anyone to get your record.


