As Legion members we are not always aware of the many youth programs we have available. One that we have recently sent some of our high school students to is the Law Enforcement Career Camp of Oregon.

As a retired police officer, I would have taken full advantage of this camp to see if I wanted to go into law enforcement as a career. It gives our youth the opportunity to understand police work by watching and participating with instructors who are mentoring the students. Many come to the camp with no previous exposure to police officers at a personal level and leave with a new found respect for the occupation.

The course is not easy. It is an intense one week summer camp held at Camp Rilea Training Facility, Warrenton, Oregon, with students from across Oregon. The camp focuses on a wide variety of law enforcement topics ranging from patrol and investigations to K-9 operations, forensic sciences, fish and wildlife, explosives, criminal law and much more. From the 6:00 a.m. wake-up and PT, a strict indoor and outdoor schedule of classes is held rain or shine. The camp is a unique, fun and challenging for the students, giving them a positive experience they will not forget.

The camp is open to high school students 15 to 17 in good academic standing. Also, they should have a desire to learn more about law enforcement. The cost is \$50 with the Post picking up the rest of the cost. You can contact me if you have any question.

Last year at this same time we had 343 members so we are right at a 10% increase, which is very good. This total comes from the following: The Legion = 202, SAL = 79 and ALA = 96. All three met or exceeded their 2025 goals set by The American Legion National and the Auxiliary National.

Starting shortly after the first of July, I begin receiving membership reports from The American Legion Department of Oregon that shows how many members have renewed or joined for 2026. 


